



WHAT IS THE IMDG CODE



The International Maritime Dangerous Goods (IMDG) Code contains provisions for the safe carriage of dangerous goods by sea.

The Key objectives are:

- Protect Human life.
- Prevent Marine pollution
- Facilitate the free movement of dangerous goods.

THE INTERNATIONAL MARITIME ORGANIZATION (IMO)

The IMDG Code is produced by the International Maritime Organization (IMO), a specialist United Nations (UN) agency responsible for developing and maintaining regulatory frameworks for sea transport.

The Code's provisions are based on recommendations developed by the UN. The UN Model regulations provide a uniform set of safety procedures covering consignment and transport issues such as classification, identification, packing, marking and labeling, documentation, security and training.

WHAT ARE DANGEROUS GOODS AND WHY ARE THEY USEFUL?

Dangerous goods are substances or articles which can pose a threat to people, property and/or the environment. They can exist in three physical states – as a solid, liquid or gas – and can present a range of dangers in a transport environment – flammability, toxicity (poisonous) and corrosivity being the most common. The physical state and properties affect packing, handling and transport decisions. Many dangerous goods are essential in the manufacture of other products such as cars, plastics, electronics and pharmaceuticals on which progress and world trade depend.

DIFFERENT TYPES OF DANGEROUS GOODS

For transport purposes, dangerous goods are allocated to one of nine "classes", according to the main danger they present. These are as follows:

- CLASS 1 EXPLOSIVES
- CLASS 2 GASES
- CLASS 3 FLAMMABLE LIQUIDS
- CLASS 4 FLAMMABLE SOLIDS AND OTHER FLAMMABLE SUBSTANCES
- CLASS 5 OXIDZING SUBSTANCES AND ORGANIC PEROXIDES
- CLASS 6 TOXIC AND INFECTIOUS SUBSTANCES
- CLASS 7 RADIOACTIVE MATERIAL
- CLASS 8 CORROSIVE SUBSTANCES
- CLASS 9 MISCELLANEOUS DANGEROUS SUBSTANCES AND ARTICLES

Many of these classes are sub-divided. For, example, toxic substances are allocated to class 6.1; infectious substances are allocated to class 6.2

Substances or articles are classified as "dangerous goods" for sea shipments if they meet the criteria prescribed in the IMDG Code for any of these classes. The danger(s) presented by a particular substance or articles determine the safe transport procedures for it e.g. the way it needs to be packed, whether it can be loaded in the same freight container as other dangerous goods, where it needs to be stored within the port or stowed on board the ship.

SMARTPHONE SECURITY RISKS

"THE SHIPPY LEXICON"



If you're anything like me, you're pretty attached to your Smartphone. I use mine almost constantly, checking for emails while I'm out and about; I play games on it, research work, chat, interact with social networks and enjoy the videos. I also use the camera extensively to photograph family and friends.

I'm sure I'm not alone in this wide use of my handheld multimedia computer and communication device. But do you have security software installed? Are you even aware of the risks to your Smartphone?

There seems to be a sort of general malaise among users – the tech savvy and everyday users alike – that because your computer fits in your pocket, it can't be infected by malware, Trojans, worms or other threats. This is, of course, ridiculous, and perhaps stems from the age-old misunderstanding of the nature of malware transmission.

The benefits afforded to us by Smartphone's are immense; the threats they can introduce into our lives if left unprotected are considerable.

THREATS FROM SMS



Remarkable as it may seem, the old school SMS text messaging service is a popular choice for rogue programmers working in hacking gangs around the world. SMS spam is bad enough, but have you considered that it might be a form of Smishing?

This term is used to name phishing attempts sent via SMS, and is used to fool victims into giving up personal data, perhaps to a fake delivery company. Smishing can be achieved either wholly through a return message or by being prompted to call a number where the information is recorded.

Once recorded, this information can be used to create a fake bank account.

The answer, of course, is to delete any such messages, whatever they're offering.



WI-FI & BLUETOOTH SECURITY RISKS

Free Wi-Fi hotspots always look attractive, but they can prove to be both rife with malware and provided by scammers looking to capture your personal data such as passwords, credit card data and other user-identifiable information. If you find free Wi-Fi in a public place that isn't provided by a reputable business, avoid it. Similarly, if you are using your smartphone as a mobile hotspot, make sure you have set a secure password. You should change

this each time you use the hotspot feature.

Another threat is War Texting, in which smartphone-connected car systems can be hacked by sniffing the authentication codes sent from phone to car. The best outcome of this is that you are tracked; the worst is that your car is stolen, without a key.

As such systems become more popular and widespread in cars, so many more people will become targets – as things stand, few cars can be activated in this way.

Any password that you use on your phone, whether it is for unlocking, accessing voicemail or setting up Bluetooth, should be changed from the device to something memorable. Failure to do this can lead to all sorts of problems.

OVERALL: BE AWARE

There are plenty of threats that you should be aware of, ready to strike your phone over Wi-Fi, Bluetooth, SMS, from app stores or via location tracking.

Naturally, you can't be aware of every specific threat, but with the help of the tips above, you can be aware that threats exist, and that there are steps that you can take to minimize the risks.

Once you recognize this, you should act on it – and protect your Smartphone, your data and your personal security.



Strangely some of the words that flow in a shippy conversation of sailors has not found its way to the lexicon . Words, terminology & beliefs that are so out of sync that at times they can be funny.

Keeping in mood with the Christmas season, did you know that without even a fist full of mud on board, most ships have a **Christmas Tree**. The uppermost mast on the ship's accommodation has an array of red, green & white navigational lights tapering in the form of a X'mas tree & thus called the Christmas Tree.

And guess what, the Christmas tree is situated on a "Monkey Island"-a steel Island with no monkeys. Essentially the "monkey Island "is the roof of the navigation "bridge" where the navigation officer & the "look out" sail the ship thru the thick & thin of weather-day & night.

Deviating from funny definitions, equally amusing are the various superstitions that sailors harbour in their minds.

Starting on a rather morose but touchy note, it is believed that the **ghosts of sailors** who have died on board do not leave the ship but they remain & sail on board. They are normally the **Casper** kind-friendly ghosts & they normally wear uniform & epaulettes or boilers suits & float around without feet -ofcourse. These saintly devils hide in the sea waterballast tanks & the isolated forepeak stores. Till today, Indian crew, prior entering ballast tanks or closed stores shout **"KHABARDAAR...RRR"** meaning "BEWARE...." to give the ghosts a fair chance to hide. It was also believed that despite a sea-burial her ghost decided to stay back & exist harmlessly on board. For us as juniors, her passengers cabin was out-of-bounds. Once a week, so that they don't get frightened, two stewards (instead of one) would go to clean the lady's cabin. Once in a way closer to midnight, crew members claimed to hear female giggling & singing coming from the cabin which I never believed.

Then again there is the old fun-time ritual of crossing the equator for the first time where all officers , crew & supernumeraries alike were made to paint their starboard (right) cheeks green & their port (Left)cheeks red ,shave themselves bald & bear up a sea water bath with buckets poured over them. Supernumerary ladies (officer's wives) were of course spared the bath but they did have to sacrifice few strands of precious locks to the Sea Godess "Amphitrite" but there was no respite from the painted cheeks. All ended in a noisy Gala-lunch & some enterprising Captains even gave away "Equator Crossing Certificates" so that one would not be required to go thru the same ritual the next time he/she crossed the equator. I first crossed the equator the first time in 1979 & several times thereafter but never got a "Equator Crossing Certificate"

Such were the terminology, superstitions & rituals on board merchant ships in the yester years. Unfortunately

most of them failed to weather the tough times & have become a thing of the past.

EUREKA EUREKA

Archimedes was a Greek scientist. He lives in Syracuse nearly 200 years ago. The King of the land wanted to wear a Golden Crown. He gave some gold to a goldsmith to make a suitable crown. After few days, the goldsmith brought the finished crown to the King. The crown was weighed. The weight of the crown was equal to the gold given to the goldsmith by the King. The King looked at the color of the crown. He had a suspicion. The goldsmith could have stolen some gold from the gold given to him. The King wanted to find out the truth. He asked his court scientist Archimedes to find out. The King said, "Find out how much gold had been stolen?"

How to find out the truth? Archimedes thought about the problem day and night. One day he was about to have his bath, but he was busy thinking. He did not notice the bathtub. The water in the bathtub was already full to the brim. He slid into the bathtub. Immediately a large quantity of water flowed over the brim of the bath tub. He noticed this suddenly. His brain wave worked suddenly. He jumped out of the bathtub, shouting, "Eureka! Eureka!" Eureka!" Eureka in Greek means "I have found it."

 $Different \, metals \, of \, the \, same \, weight \, have \, different \, volumes. \, Objects, \, put \, in \, water, \, will \, displace \, water. \, The \, displaced \, water \, will \, be \, equal \, to \, their \, volume.$

For example, an iron cube weighing a kilogram will disperse some water. But an aluminums cube of the same weight will displace more water than the iron cube.

Archimedes knew all these theories. Using this as the basic knowledge, Archimedes worked out a plan to find out the purity of the crown.

Archimedes took two bowls. He filled them with water to the brim. Then he placed each bowl separately in the middle of the large vessels. He placed the crown in one bowl. Water overflowed. It collected at the bottom of the outer vessel. Then he took a cube of pure gold. This cube of gold was equal in weight to the crown. He kept this gold cube in the middle of the second bowl. Here also water overflowed. Water got collected at the bottom of the outer bowl.

Archimedes then measured the quantity of water in the two vessels. He found out the difference in the water overflow. The crown had sent out more water. The cube of gold had sent out less water. But both the crown and the gold cube were of the same weight. So, they should have sent out the same quantity of water. Therefore, the crown had some other metals mixed in it. These metals took up more space in the water than pure gold.


Archimedes reported this finding to the King. The King demanded the truth from the goldsmith. The goldsmith then confessed. He had stolen some gold. He had added some other metals.

Think clearly. You can find solutions to new problems.






MERCHANT RESTRICTIONS:


Merchants identify brands that cannot be shipped to certain countries, often due to licensing agreements.
